Mr Mellow Likes Yellow

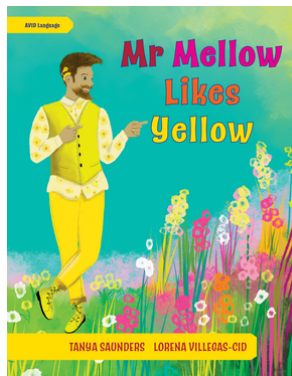
Mr Mellow loves yellow—but can his colourful animal crew convince him to love red, green, blue, and more?

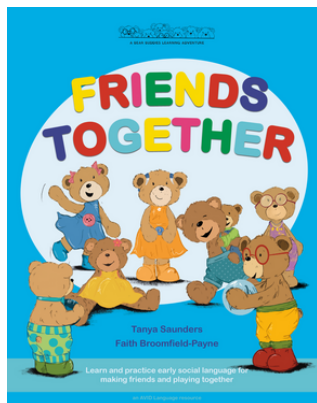
This gently funny story helps deaf and hard-of-hearing children explore their feelings about hearing devices and understand why wearing them makes life safer—and a lot more fun!
